

## The Ethics of Self-Care, Cultural Competency, Difficult Conversations and More Ethics!

**We focus on ethical principles in many different ways in this innovative, interactive and engaging training.** To begin the day our esteemed presenter Jenny Buckley, Hospice nurse and blogger will look at ethical frameworks and having difficult conversations with our clients/patients. In this unique training which was developed by social worker Anne McSweeney, LCSW – we will explore different ethical aspects of care. Long-term care and end-of-life conversations can be very difficult to initiate – both for professionals with their clients/patients and for family members. There is often dread and fear about bringing up long-term care or end-of-life wishes. We will also explore the ethics and necessity of having these conversations – looking at ethical principles around informed consent, autonomy vs. safety and dignity vs. risk. From here, we will take a closer look at cultural competency and ethics – using the powerful resource of the documentary film series “Worlds Apart. We will review case scenarios from “World’s Apart” – looking at culture and more ethical principles to consider. We will close by exploring the ethics of self-care. As helping professionals, we inform our clients/patients of the importance of self-care, while many of us are over-worked and under-performing due to compassion fatigue or burnout. Jenny, our presenter for this session, will guide attendees through self-care practices, ethical codes pertaining to self-care and the importance of self-care as a pre-requisite for adequate patient/client care. Jenny’s approach is simple yet effective, as she breaks down practical methods to incorporate self-care into your work. Attendees will leave with a take-away that will keep you encouraged all throughout the year!
