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Especially Challenging DNR Scenarios

Do not resuscitate (DNR) orders are often the source of confusion in the clinical setting, particularly around when the order applies, what it covers and what it does not, and who is permitted to provide consent. In this presentation, ethicist and lawyer Kevin Wack will highlight some particularly challenging DNR scenarios and discuss them in a way that clarifies some of this ambiguity.
