
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## **Hello, Can We Please Talk About This?**

Difficult Conversations, Ethics and A Great Tool to Reframe  
and Start Discussions

**Long-term care and end-of-life conversations can be very difficult to initiate – both for professionals with their clients/patients and for family members.** There is often dread and fear about bringing up long-term care or end-of-life wishes. This innovative CE training will explore possible ways to reframe this conversation – using an innovative, new tool called “The Hello Game”. We will also explore the ethics and necessity of having these conversations – looking at ethical principles around informed consent, autonomy vs. safety and dignity vs. risk. We will begin by reviewing ethical standards and moving into an interactive round-table discussion – using the resource of the Hello Game to initiate conversations. Whether you are a social worker, nurse, case manager or other allied health professionals – you will gain “hands-on” knowledge and resources to better facilitate these conversations with your clients/patients.
