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“Turning Thirty, The Musical”: A Patient-Centered Perspective

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In the hectic lives of healthcare professionals, it is often difficult to view situations through our patients’ eyes. How does it truly feel to receive a devastating diagnosis? What is the toll it takes physically and emotionally on your body?
