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Ethical Wills - Leaving Your Legacy Through Love and Values

Ethical Wills are not a new concept – in fact, the Hebrew Bible first described Ethical Wills around 3000 years ago. In addition, references to this type of tradition were also found in other religious texts and in other cultures. An Ethical Will is a personal document, a legacy letter – meant to pass along your values, experiences, life lessons, hopes and dreams for the future, regrets and even forgiveness to your family, friends and community. Oftentimes, Ethical Wills are written at a turning point in a person’s life, perhaps when facing a challenging situation such as a terminal illness or end-of-life. Optimally, they can be shared with family and friends while the writer is still living; but it’s also a very special and meaningful way for a person to leave their legacy behind. Social workers, case managers, nurses and other clinicians can use the premise of Ethical Wills as a way of helping their clients and families cope with end of life issues. In this unique and powerful presentation, you will learn the definition and components to an Ethical Will. We will also watch a brief documentary video on Dignity Therapy, amplifying how components of Ethical Wills can be tied into this process. Attendees will also have the opportunity to begin constructing their own Ethical Will – a powerful process that we can then share with our clients, families, and loved ones.
