In this timely conversation, Jason Lesandrini, Medical Ethicist, will guide us through a conversation about ethics and ethical issues that have occurred in the pandemic. Starting with a thorough overview of the professional ethics codes and standards, we will spend a significant amount of time on Justice - what it means, what are the principles of

Justice, and how should this ethical standard apply in the allocation of resources in non-pandemic times. We will then segue into an overview of the ethical challenges that healthcare sites have faced with regard to resource allocation, as well as other ethical issues such as discharge planning for COVID patients, visitor restrictions, DNR orders, and much more. Concluding with an important conversation about moral distress and its effects on helping professionals and the patients we serve. Join us for this important discussion on ethical reflection and decision-making during this world-wide pandemic.
